Happy New Year! We've seen many changes in our lodge in 2009, and have had many opportunities to make a positive impact on Scouting in Vermont. I challenge the lodge to raise the bar of cheerful service in the Green Mountain Council in the coming year. I know that together, as a team – as chapters, as lodge committees, and as a lodge – we can surpass our own expectations in the months ahead and reach our goal of providing quality service to each Cub Pack, Scout Troop, and Venture Crew in our council.

January begins 2010 as a busy month for our lodge: we have many opportunities for involvement to include the Lodge Executive Committee meeting on January 10 (which has passed as of the mailing of this newsletter, but was announced in the final Buck of 2009), the Section NE-2A Quality Lodge Summit and Council of Chiefs meeting in Lenox, Massachusetts (the registration deadline closed on January 8 as posted on the lodge website), and the first of four fabulous Winter Treks on January 22-24 at Mount Norris Scout Reservation. The Winter Trek program has been a successful staple of our council's program for many years, and the lodge has been asked to step forward and provide cheerful service in its support this year. For opportunities to serve, please contact any member of the Lodge Executive Committee. These are creeping up soon, so volunteer now!

Other events on our calendar for 2010 include The Camp Sunrise spring ordeal on May 14 – 16, the Section NE-2A conclave at Camp Sequassen in Connecticut on June 11 – 13, The Mount Norris spring ordeal and Vigil Honor induction on June 18 – 20, another LEC meeting on August 22 at the council service center, the Mount Norris fall ordeal on September 10 – 12, and the fall fellowship and Cub Scout Haunted Harvest Festival on October 15 – 17. To top it all off, we have an enormous opportunity for service at the Green Mountain Council's Centennial Camporee at Mount Norris from October 1 – 3, 2010. This will be a once-in-a-lifetime event in our council to celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the BSA, and should prove to be a very memorable event. All of these events will require many hands to be successful – plan to step forward and get involved! We can't do it all alone (after all...many hands make light work!), so attend and actively participate in your chapter meetings and events in addition to all of the wonderful opportunities that I've mentioned above. We hope to have every lodge member involved in the planning and execution of these events. Contact your lodge leadership for more information and to sign up.

The summer of 2010 will see us back at camp! Mount Norris S.R. is once again open for business!! If your troop hasn't signed up for a week of resident camp, we strongly recommend that you do so soon – spaces are filling up fast. As members of our Order, one of our missions is to promote Scout camping to our council – so help your chapter by conducting camp promotion presentations for all of our programs: Mount Norris, Camp Sunrise (for Cub Scouts), and Frontiers Camp at Mount Norris! We can have one of the most successful camping seasons in Green Mountain Council history, but only if we reach every Scout unit in Vermont with a camp promotion visit. If you are 15 years of age, sign up to be a Counselor-in-Training at Norris or Sunrise, or if you are at least 16, challenge yourself and become a member of either camp's staff; trust me – it is an experience that you'll NEVER FORGET. Contact the GMC service center for more information and to submit an application. Ajapeu Lodge will again have a strong presence at Mount Norris: look for and participate in weekly service projects, the OA cracker barrel, and if you are eligible for Brotherhood conversion...you can complete it during your stay at camp!! If your troop is attending a resident camp out of state and you want to complete your Brotherhood conversion there, you must have pre-approval from the lodge before you sign up. Please contact me directly, and I will write up the required documentation for submittal to the camp's host lodge.

And of course, don't forget the 2010 National Scout Jamboree at Fort A.P. Hill in beautiful Caroline County, Virginia. There are still openings for contingent members as well as Jamboree staff (including many OA staff opportunities). Contact the GMC service center or check the website for more information. I'll see you at the Hill!!

In closing, I'd like to take a moment to send special thanks to members of the council service center staff who have provided outstanding service in support of our lodge: Janet Ruggles-Power, Arlene Matheson, Laurie Sneed, and Mary Lou Santin have performed many of the behind-the-scenes tasks that are essential to the successful operation of the lodge in 2009. Our continued success is a credit to these devoted council employees. Take a moment to thank them for their service! And last, but certainly not least – I'd like to personally thank each and every Scoutmaster, Cubmaster, and Venturing leader for service to their units. Without you, our lodge would not be as successful as it is. ## We're Looking For Lodge History...

Were you a member of any of Ajapeu Lodge's predecessor lodges in Vermont? Do you have valuable historical information and stories that you'd like to share? If so, or if you know someone who does, then please read on...

As a lodge, one of our most valuable resources (in addition to our members!) is the wealth of history that exists regarding the lodges that came before Ajapeu: Wisie Hal'a Con #351, Nianque #398, Memphremagog #398, and Nicaweegee #493. In an essence, we must have an appreciation of where we've been to know where we're going. Knowing, appreciating, and educating our membership about our history is a major component of our service to Scouting in Vermont. The historical information exists...we just need to find and document it!

In reality, this effort has been ongoing for a number of years. Lodge members Stan Burnham and Rick Holcomb have worked hard for at least 10 years to piece together our past, not only the history of the current Ajapeu Lodge #351, chartered to the current Green Mountain Council #592, but they've also concentrated on the now-extinct southern Vermont lodges – Nianque #398 (Ethan Allen Council – Rutland), Memphremagog #398 (Green Mountain Council – Rutland), and Nicaweegee #493 (Calvin Coolidge Council – Bellows Falls). These two Arrowmen are always interested in any information, and can be easily contacted through the lodge leadership.

We knew very little about Wisie Hal'a Con #351 (Long Trail Council – Burlington) until just two years ago. Lodge Adviser Barry Simays actually stumbled on a gold mine while talking with Wisie Hal'a Con lodge secretary Dick Ward (1950's) at a Mount Norris Alumni Association reunion in 2008. Since then, he's been in contact with lodge officers from the 1950's, 1960's, and 1970's (some as far away as Texas and California); these brothers have provided a wealth of insight into our past through pictures, newsletters, meeting minutes, membership rosters, and memories. Many gaps have been filled but many more still exist.

So, here is the request: we are asking any current or former lodge members of any Order of the Arrow lodge in Vermont who may have any kind of historical information that we can add to our records to contact Lodge Adviser Barry Simays at [simaysb449@yahoo.com](mailto:simaysb449@yahoo.com), phone (802) 363-3655, or by mail to 881 Vermont Route 15, Underhill, Vermont 05489. We would prefer to receive scans or photocopies of documents and pictures as opposed to original documents. Written personal histories are also welcomed. Barry will retain any Wisie Hal'a Con material (it's become a personal project for the lodge), and any material pertaining to the other lodges listed above will be forwarded to Stan Burnham and Rick Holcomb.

The goal is to be able to accumulate this information into book and electronic format for all lodge members to share. In the meantime, COME TO OUR LODGE EVENTS! Many members usually bring their "histories-in-progress", and are always willing to share the information that they've obtained!

## Chapter 2 Service Project

Chapter 2 completed a chapter wide service project on May 30, 2009. We had 17 Arrowmen come together to help clean up the Hartland Dam Nature Trails, the area we have used in the past for our annual Klondike Derby. A major storm had come through and knocked dozens of trees over throughout the property.



We came in wielding saws, axes, and clippers. We split into two groups, one went in through the top, cleaning up brush and trees, as well as painting blazes on trees to reestablish the pathway. The other group entered the forest from the lower end and came up the opposite way where there was a large cluster of hefty trees leaning on each other across the trail.

After close to 2 hours of cutting and hauling wood off the trail, the upper group had made their way through their end of the trail and they came up on the other end where the lower group was still hogging their way through the heap of danger trees. All 17 volunteers worked together to clean up the area, and make it travelable.

The work went fast with all of the 17 volunteer Arrowmen chipping in. The entire trail had been cleaned up in just 2 hours, but it would not have been possible without every volunteer participating.

"A JOURNEY THROUGH TIME"**

Each year, over 300 Arrowmen from across Connecticut, Massachusetts, Vermont, New York, and Europe gather for the annual Section Conclave, a weekend-long event designed to help unify the Lodges in our Section, provide an inspiring training program, and most of all, have fun!
