To all our Unit Leaders,

Included in this year's re-charter kit are a couple of changes and forms that will require your special attention. Your cooperation will expedite the charter renewal process and will help your Unit, your District, and your Council improve their program for the coming year.

1. Re-chartering must be done on-line. If you do not have a computer or access to one, recruit a parent who does. It's a great way to get more parents involved in your Unit's program.
2. On-line re-chartering will begin the first of November. If you complete and submit the required documentation by the end of November you will qualify as an Early Bird and will receive an Early Bird streamer for your unit flag. That should be everyone's goal.
3. The required forms and payment must be turned into your Unit Commissioner for final approval. Any charters mailed or dropped off at the Waterbury Service Center without your Commissioner's signature will not be processed.
4. Included in the re-charter kit is an FOS presentation sign up sheet. Every parent in every unit should be given the opportunity to donate to this campaign if they so chose, so please sign up for one of these brief presentations. The benefits to your Unit, your District and your Council will be immeasurable.
5. A copy of your 2009 Centennial Quality Unit Commitment form is included in the kit. Please fill in as many of the actual numbers that you can and be prepared to discuss it with your Commissioner. Once completed, your commissioner will transcribe the information to the 2010 Commitment form (also included in the kit) where he/she will then ask you for your Commitments for the 2010 year. Please be prepared for that discussion.
