## Policies

**PAYMENTS:** All payments must be received **at least two weeks prior** to your scheduled arrival.

**SLEEPING ACCOMODATIONS:** Sleeping accommodations are pre-arranged at local schools with showers available. We recommend you bring sandals and swim suits for bathing. Separate male and female sleeping accommodations are provided. Bring plenty of padding with you. Scouts are encouraged to bring air mattresses or folding cots.

**GROUP LESSONS:** The Resorts now require advance registration for all learning packages and group lessons. We will need to know 7 days before your trip the number of lessons, the level\* and Ski or Snowboard. Lessons cannot be arranged the week before your trip.

\*Level 1: Never skied or snowboarded before

\*Level 2: You can hold a wedge and want to work on turning and speed control

\*Level 3: You can make wedge turns in both directions and want to gain more control and confidence.

**ROSTERS REQUIRED:** Please use the roster which can be downloaded from our website. **If you use your own roster, please include the same information that is on our form .**

**INSURANCE REQUIRED:** Many Scouting units have accident and sickness insurance through their unit or their local council. Proof of Accident and Sickness insurance (Company name, policy holder, policy number) must be included with reservation. If you do not have such insurance, it can be purchased through the Green Mountain Council for \$3.00 per person.
