## THE VISITING SPARTAN

Once, a Spartan was visiting the City of Athens. His Athenian host threw a banquet in the Spartan's honor. Wishing to show off to his guest, the Athenian introduced the Spartan to several illustrious guests around the room. "That man is the greatest sculptor in Greece," he declared, "and that man is the finest architect and has built many monuments." In Greek times, it was a great honor to let a quest choose their own chair, however the tallest chair at the head of the table was off limits, it belonged to the host. As the other guests waited for the Spartan to choose his seat, each hoping it would be next to them, but he paused. There was an old man that had been running back and forth from the cooking area to the banquet table. He had displayed a large hog, warm bread and large bowls of fresh fruit. Before making his decision the Spartan asked, "Who is that old man over there?" The Athenian replied, "He's just the cook." The Spartan decided to sit in the chair next to the tallest chair where the host always sits. Everyone sat down and was ready to feast. Suddenly, the Spartan called for the cook and the old man ran quickly to his side. The cook expected the worst. The Spartan looked at his host and said, "Athenian, you have done 2 things wrong, first you didn't introduce me to the best cook in Athens, and second.....you are sitting in HIS chair." The Spartan told the cook, "sit next to me in the chair at the head of the table my friend, you are the only one here that needs to be honored."

## History of Thermopylae, 480BC (The Aftermath)

The battle of Thermopylae, and particularly the Spartans' role in it, soon acquired mythical status amongst the Greeks. Free men, in respect of their own laws, had sacrificed themselves in order to defend their way of life against foreign aggression. As Simonedes' epitaph at the site of the fallen stated: 'Go tell the Spartans, you who read: We took their orders and here lie dead'.

A glorious defeat maybe, but the fact remained that the way was now clear for Xerxes to push on into mainland Greece. The Greeks, though, were far from finished, and despite many states now turning over to the Persians and Athens itself being sacked, a Greek army led by Leonidas' brother Kleombrotos began to build a defensive wall near Corinth. Winter halted the land campaign, though, and at Salamis the Greek fleet manoeuvred the Persians into shallow waters and won a resounding victory. Xerxes returned home to his palace at Sousa and left the gifted general Mardonius in charge of the invasion. After a series of political negotiations it became clear that the Persians would not gain victory through diplomacy and the two armies met at Plataea in August 479 BC. The Greeks, fielding the largest hoplite army ever seen, won the battle and finally ended Xerxes' ambitions in Greece.
