### SPARTAN DEPLOYMENT

#### Did you know that Spartan mercenaries fought for the last Egyptian Pharaoh?

King Agesilaus II spent his final days leading a mercenary Spartan army in Egypt. In 362 BC, at around 80 years of age, King Agesilaus II was summoned by Pharaoh Nectanebo I to lead his Egyptian forces against the Persians. (Egypt had been conquered by the Persians in 525 BC, but then later regained independence). Agesilaus saw this as a good opportunity to increase diplomatic and trade relations with Egypt, as well as to fill the coffers of an otherwise declining Spartan state and punish the Persians for their previous actions against the Spartans.

What happened next can only be described as political chaos. Shortly after Agesilaus arrived in Egypt a group of Egyptian troops rebelled against Nectanebo, and the rest then deserted him. Nectanebo fled for his life while he could still escape. This left Agesilaus with no obvious employer, and no guarantee of payment. Agesilaus was then in the position of deciding which of these two groups of Egyptians to support. Agesilaus chose the right side, helping to secure Nectanebo's grandson, Nectanebo II as the Pharaoh. (Nectanebo II would be the last native Pharoah of Egypt). Nectanebo II paid Agesialus well for his services, and the Spartan king set about returning home. But it was a journey he was never to complete. Agesilaus died peacefully in North Africa on the way home to Sparta.

## HISTORY OF THERMOPYLAE

(Seven Days)

When the invading Persian King Xerxes heard from Demaratus that Spartan King Leonidas was leading an army of the resistance fighters, made of 300 Spartans and 7,000 other Greeks he couldn't believe it. Xerxes asked his scouts why an army of so few would dare fight against his massive army. "O king," Demaratus answered, "use me as a liar, if the event of this be not what I tell you."

Xerxes would not believe him. For 4 days Xerxes waited expecting that Leonidas would retreat. On the 5<sup>th</sup> day, seeing them not withdraw and acting defiant to his superiority, angered Xerxes. He sent the Medes forces to attack, instructing them take the Spartans alive and bring them into his presence. The Medes charged; many fell, and others attacked in turn; and though they suffered grievous defeat, they kept attacking in waves. The Medes were badly butchered, and ordered to retreat from the fight.

The elite Persian warriors, whom the Xerxes called "Immortals" attacked next. It was thought that they at least would make short and easy work of the Spartans; but fighting in a narrow space, as well as having shorter spears than the Spartans there was no advantage of their greater numbers, Leonidas proved to be strategically brilliant. Among many of his military strategies, he instructed small groups of Spartans to turn their backs and pretend to run away. The Immortals would chase after them, and just when it seemed like they were to be overtaken, the Spartans turned back upon the Immortals and slaughtered them. For this maneuver to work a few of the Spartans had to be sacrificed which they were happy to give their lives for the greater good. The Immortals attacking by companies and in every other fashion, could not gain an inch, they too drew out of the fight.
