What is a Cub Scout Pow Wow?


POW WOW is a Council-wide adult training for everyone interested in Cub Scouting—


Starting at 9:00 a.m., class sessions will begin on the hour and run for 50 minutes. Six to eight courses will be offered each hour.



What Makes a Trained Leader?

A Cub Scout leader is considered fully trained and entitled to wear the trained leader emblem upon completion of these courses.

◇ **Youth Protection Training** is **REQUIRED** for all registered leaders. At all times, youth safety is the number one priority; at the same time, adults need to know the rules for keeping themselves safe, too. New leader registrations will not be accepted if they do not include proof of completing this course.

◇ *Trained leaders must refresh this knowledge, retaking this training every two years.*

◇ **Leader-Specific Training is required for:**

- ◆ Cubmaster and assistant(s)
- ◆ Tiger Cub leaders
- ◆ Wolf and Bear leaders
- ◆ Webelos leaders
- ◆ Pack Committee members

Leaders now need to complete this training one time for all den leader positions.

We strongly recommend that the Position-Specific Training be taken at **PowWow or sooner**. Take advantage of the opportunity to learn from experienced leaders, ask lots of questions, interact with other Cub Scout leaders, and **HAVE FUN!**

BALOO at Pow Wow 2017 Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO)

Introduces leaders and parents to the skills needed to plan and conduct pack outdoor activities, particularly pack camping. Participants who complete this training course will

- Understand the focus of the Cub Scout level of the BSA outdoor program.
- Gain the skills needed to plan and carry out a successful Cub Scout-level overnight activity.
- Learn more about the BSA resources available for carrying out this activity.

Ask a boy why he wants to be a Cub Scout, and 9 times out of 10 he'll Answer, "to go camping." BALOO

training assures that your pack plans a successful overnight camping experience, making your Pack campout a safe and fun one.

National BSA Policy states that pack overnights must be organized and led by at least one adult leader who has successfully completed BALOO training. **More than one BALOO-trained leader is recommended for each Pack.**

Pre-registration is required.

Class size is limited to the first 20 paid registrations received at the Council Service Center

BALOO is an all-day course.
Parts of this training will be held outdoors.
Please dress appropriately.

Den Chief Training at PowWow 2017

What Is a Den Chief?

He is an older Boy Scout or Venturer, recommended by his Scoutmaster or Venturing Advisor in cooperation with the Cubmaster, and approved by the Pack Committee. He (or she, in the case of Venturers) is a Scout who assists a Cub Scout or Webelos den leader at den meetings, pack meetings, and other events. He's a ready source of games, songs, skits, and skills, and he encourages the boys in their advancement.

Why Is a Den Chief Important?

The Den Chief is a key means of building relationships between the Pack and Troop.

The Den Chief regularly reminds the boys about Boy Scouts in a positive way as he leads activities and shares his enthusiasm for Scouting with the Cub Scouts. He can tell them about Boy Scouting

with its outdoor activities, trips, summer camp, and opportunities for advancement. When it's time for them to move up to a Webelos den or a Boy Scout troop, his example and encouragement can help them decide to make that transition.

As a Den Chief, you have something important to offer your den:



- Scouting and Campcraft Skills
- Hobby and Sports Skills
- Leadership Skills
- Scout Spirit
- Know the "Ropes"
- Understand the Scouts' Problems, Fears
- Know What's Fun, What "Works"

- Sense of Discovery

You are a *Boy Scout Role Model* for the Scouts in your den

Den Chief Training is a 3-hour morning class designed for Den Chiefs **AND** their Cub or Webelos Leader. Den Chiefs will also attend specified afternoon class sessions to learn more about how to be effective leaders in their den. Adult partners may choose from any of the afternoon PowWow classes.

IMPORTANT: In order for a Den Chief to attend this training, his Den/Webelos Leader or another member of the pack **must** also attend Den Chief Training. Leaders will learn how to effectively utilize their Den Chief, and their participation in training will ensure a successful relationship.

Class size is limited to the first 14 paid youth/adult teams received at Council Service Center. *SIGN UP NOW!*

Scoutmaster Leader-Specific Training /ILST

Scoutmaster Leader-Specific Training is the first of two training courses required by the Green Mountain Council for Scoutmasters and Assistant-Scoutmasters.

Class could run until 5:00.

ILST is a workshop to teach Scouts about leadership roles.

Workshop is for Scoutmasters and their SPL's.

ASM's and ASPL's are welcome. No lone Scouts and no more than 2 Scouts from the same troop.
